Elmhurst Primary Care Grand Rounds: 2019-2020 Clinical Year in Review

Medical knowledge is continuously evolving. Staying current on the latest developments and studies outlined in medical journals can be challenging for clinicians with time constraints and professional demands. This can be especially true for the primary care physician because of the large clinical variations in their patient population. This primary care conference will offer a 2019-2020 literature review and summary of research trends for six sub-specialties of internal medicine: Infectious Disease, Cardiology, Gastroenterology, Pulmonology, Endocrinology, Oncology. Specialists from these disciplines will discuss some of the highlights and latest developments in their field from the past year and provide attendees with resources that can be applicable for clinical practice.
